Dear Parents & Carers.

Uniform Rules - Reminder

We have noticed that while lots of children look very smart in their school clothes, quite a few are not sticking to the rules for our uniform. This is something we will be looking at closely in the coming weeks and enforcing more rigorously, so a quick reminder of some of our school uniform expectations:

- **Grey** school trousers, skirt or pinafore dress (Reminder: **NO LEGGINGS** on non-PE days)
- Black school shoes. If trainers are worn they must be <u>all black</u> (<u>no</u> colour, stripes etc.)
- <u>No jewellery</u> except <u>one</u> pair of <u>small</u> studs that may be worn but must be covered or removed for PE. <u>No</u> chains, rings or bracelets.
- <u>No smart watches</u> analogue watches or simple digital watches may be worn.


Miss Wright & Miss Creed say...






Mrs Cushing. Mrs Boyce & Miss Okey say...

- Starting school Year R (Reception) or transferring to Year 3 (Junior School): Applications are open from 1st November 2024 to 15th January 2025.
- Transfer to Year 7 (secondary school): Applications are open until midnight 31st October 2024.
