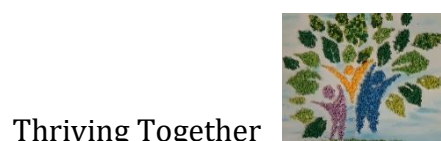

Subject	Areas Covered
Learning Enrichment	<p>Video calling someone in Perth and asking them questions. Emailing and postcards to and from Australia to find out information. Using Google Earth to look at different localities</p>
English	<p><u>Phonics</u> Spelling rules- drop e, double rule, y to an I rule, y, ai Revision of Year 1 learning including split vowel digraphs</p> <p><u>Reading:</u> Reading focuses include – decoding, fluency, comprehension, vocabulary and language understanding</p> <p><u>Writing:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Story retelling of ‘Lost and Found’ by Oliver Jeffers - Information text about an Australian animal - Instruction and letter writing linked to Christmas
Mathematics	<p>Addition and subtraction -Add and subtract any 2digit numbers using a structured number line with bridging or by drawing dienes. -Solve word problems involving addition and subtraction</p> <p>Multiplication -Multiplication facts for the 2 and 5 multiplication tables -Solve multiplication number sentences mentally or by drawing arrays. - Solving word problems involving multiplication.</p> <p>Division -Solve division number sentences mentally or by drawing arrays. - Solving word problems involving division</p> <p>Data Handling collecting, recording and asking questions about data (link to Science - habitats)</p>
Science	<p>Habitats</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What is a habitat? - Matching animals to their habitats- playing odd one out
