Subject	Areas Covered
Learning Enrichment	The ‘Great Fire of Tadley!’ Re-enactment of the Great Fire.
English	<p><u>Phonics</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Revision of Year 1 learning. -Spelling rules- dge, g, c, kn, gn, wr, le, il, el, al, homophones. -Vowel suffix rules- drop e, double consonant, y to an i. <p><u>Reading:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Reading focuses include – decoding, fluency, comprehension, vocabulary and language understanding. <p><u>Writing:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Character descriptions based on the BFG. -Instruction writing linked to George’s Marvellous Medicine. -Letter and diary writing linked to The Great Fire of London. -Poetry writing based on the Great Fire of London. -Children will be writing their own fables.
Mathematics	<p><u>Place Value</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Exploring numbers within 20. -Partitioning numbers into tens and ones. -Estimating numbers on a number line. <p><u>Addition and Subtraction</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Adding to the nearest 10. -Bridging through 10s. -Finding 2 more and 2 less. -Adding and subtracting a 2digit number and a multiple of 10.
Science	<p><u>Materials</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Investigate what happens when materials change by bending, twisting, stretching and squashing. -Identify ways materials are used for everyday objects. -Investigate the suitability of materials for different jobs.

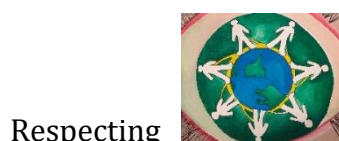

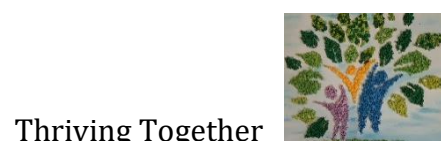
History	<p>Cause and consequence</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Investigate what happened in the Great Fire of London through sources of evidence. -Examine the causes and consequences of the fire. -Investigate why the fire spread for so far and for so long. -Examine eye-witness reports and discuss their reliability.
Music	<p>Exploring dynamics and tempo</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Respond to, recognise and identify louder, quieter, faster and slower sounds. -Explore how dynamics and tempo can be used to portray different characteristics.
Physical Education	<p>Games/agility</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Dance -Co-ordination -Balance
My Happy Mind	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Learn what our brains look like and how it helps us. -Learn that our brain has 3 parts. -Learn how our brain grows and what neuroplasticity is. -Learn how Team H-A-P helps us be our best self. -Learn which emotions might impact Team H-A-P. -Learn how Happy Breathing can help us. -Learn how our brain reacts in different situations.
Religious Education	<p>Special places</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Thinking about what places are special to us and why. -Investigating why churches are a special place for Christians.
Art	<p>Collage</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Create a collage to represent the Great Fire of London using different materials. -Study and draw in the style of an artist – Quentin Blake illustrator. -Learn the technique of colourwash with water colours
Computing	<p>IT around us</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Recognise the uses and features of information technology -Identify the uses of information technology in the school -Identify information technology beyond school -Explain how information technology helps us -Explain how to use information technology safely -Recognise that choices are made when using IT
