




<p>See if you can find a recipe for a WW2 meal. You can make the meal, take photos of yourself making it and write about what you did. Look online for ideas of what they looked like and even ideas of how to make one!</p> 	<p>Write a poem about the war, a soldier or an evacuee. Can you make it rhyme? Does it have to?</p> 	<p>Research how WW2 affected your family. You could interview relatives, look at old photos etc. Write a report on how WW2 affected your family or write an interview with a family member who was affected.</p>
