This year, we will be regularly sharing what the children have been doing in school. From maths and spellings, to school trips and visitors, the children are always very busy!

by Roald Dahl. Alongside this, we have looked at the illustrator Quentin Blake and his great drawings of the BFG. We have been working hard on place





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

Science has been fun. We have explored different materials, discussing what they are made of, sorting them and thinking about their properties.

Wow! What a fantastic start to Year 3 it has been! The children have settled in really well and we are looking forward to an exciting first half term. We have been reading the story Woolly Mammoth and

<u>Uniform reminder</u>

During the last few years, we have had periods where school uniform has not been required and we have not focused our attention on reinforcing our Uniform Policy. However, as we start a new year, I would like remind you of our expectations and request your support. Our expectations on school uniform are explained in the extract below, taken directly from our school prospectus:

"We believe wearing school uniform is practical and smart and contributes to a sense of belonging and school pride. Much of our uniform can be bought in the high street shops, but school specific items are available from our school offices and Skoolkit (in Basingstoke). Our uniform for boys comprises grey or black trousers or shorts, white polo shirt and red sweatshirt. Girls may wear grey or black trousers, pinafore dress or skirt, white polo shirt, red sweatshirt or cardigan or a red and white striped or checked dress for the summer."

We have noticed this year that a number of children are wearing the following items of clothing/accessories:





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- Trainers instead of school shoes
- Smart watches and Fitbits
- Earrings other than studs

On PE days, some children are coming to school in a range of branded sports kit when they should just be wearing their school PE kit.

Attendance

Regular school attendance is important since, without it, all the efforts of our teachers come to nothing. Children need to attend regularly if they are to enjoy the educational opportunities provided within the school and make progress. Absence can lead to educational disadvantage for a child and place them at risk of not achieving. As part of our duty of care and the Government's drive to raise Standards in schools, we are required to monitor attendance regularly and will be writing to parents if their child's attendance falls below 90%. The government has released new guidance for schools to support improving attendance rates following

the pandemic. Please find attached to this newsletter our leaflet 'Parents Guide to Attendance at Bishopswood'.




2023 Starters Year R Open Days
