<p>Design your own information poster about the Great Fire of London. Don't forget to include all the important facts!</p>	<p>The fire started in a bakery. With the help of an adult, you could make bread or cakes which would have been made in the bakery. Take photos to share with the class!</p>	<p>Pretend you are a news reporter in 1666. Write a newspaper report describing the event. Hint: What could you use to make your newspaper report look old?</p>
<p>Create a picture showing a scene from London during the Great Fire. You could draw, paint, collage, use chalks or use a computer paint package to create your picture.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">What happened in the Great Fire of London?</p> 	<p>We have been practising our numbers to 100. Can you make your own number line to help you practise? Ask an adult to challenge you with counting forwards and backwards.</p>
<p>Draw a picture or make a model to show how you would have redesigned the city following the Great Fire. You could use your knowledge from our science topic 'materials' to decide what to use to build the new homes.</p>		<p>Practise your handwriting remembering which letters should be taller or longer. Can you think of a word starting with each letter which links to the Great Fire of London?</p>
<p>In music we have been learning the song 'London's Burning'. Can you make up your own song about the Great Fire?</p>	<p>Design a new bakery for Thomas Farriner. Draw and label a plan to show each feature you would include.</p>	<p>Research 'The Great Fire of London' using the internet or books. Hand write or type up your findings in your own words. You may wish to add pictures downloaded from the internet.</p>
