This is a list of suggested activities that can be completed if your child is unable to attend school but well enough to complete activities. There is an English, Maths and Topic activity for each day. These are from the Oaks National Academy and each have a small video clip with a teacher giving instructions and explaining a task for the children to do during the video. Don't forget to continue reading at home regularly, both reading to an adult and enjoying books together. <p>Day 1 To understand what it means to have a job</p>	<p>In this lesson we learn about jobs with Miss Hughes and what it means to have a job. We look at different types of job and decide what would be our dream job. We consider what we would need to do in this role and practise for the future by acting it out with our teddies.</p>	<p>https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/to-understand-what-it-means-to-have-a-job-c5hpad</p>	<p>Listen to the story and then have a think of the different types of jobs people do. Then you will be asked to look at some images and think about what jobs the people might do. Finally, you can draw a picture of your dream job, maybe write a sentence and then you could act it out!</p>
<p>Day 2 To understand the difference between hot and cold</p>	<p>In this lesson, we will identify things that are hot and things that are cold. You will be asked to consider differences between hot and cold places in the environment. The video will ask you to complete an experiment using ice cubes and ask you to answer some questions all about your experiment.</p>
<p>Day 3 To name things that you can see outside in winter</p>	<p>In this lesson, we will identify things that we can see outside in winter. We will think about the colours of the season and create a drawing of things that we can see on a winter walk.</p>	<p>https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/to-name-things-that-you-can-see-outside-in-winter-c4t3ec</p>	<p>Whilst watching the video, it will ask you to think about hot and cold colours as well as signs of Winter. Then, you can draw your own Winter scene, using all of your wonderful wintery ideas.</p>
<p>Day 4 Stop Look Listen!</p>	<p>In today's lesson you will be thinking about dangers in the environment, when you are out and about in your local neighbourhood. You will learn about the dangers to look out for and safe places you can play. You will learn the safety rules to follow for different spaces you may visit. From this you will show your understanding by creating a safe space model.</p>	<p>https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/stop-look-listen-6rr68e</p>	<p>When listening to the video you will learn about dangers that we have to think about each day. Can you remember the safety rules once you have finished learning? Maybe you could make a stop, look, listen poster to keep everyone safe around you and remind them of the rules.</p>
<p>Day 5 Music- Walking on my street</p>	<p>Our first adventure of this unit will take us on a journey around our neighbourhood. We will be using singing games to explore beat, note duration and rhyme. In this lesson, we will take part in our first imaginative listening activity.
