# Year 5 - Spring 1

Dear Parents,

We are delighted to welcome all the children back and hope that you enjoyed your Christmas break. Year 5 had a successful autumn term: they created their water rafts, played their brass instruments for Year 3 and 4 children and performed their Carols Around the Tree concert. Spring term is going to be just as busy and filled with lots of exciting lessons.

#### **Learning Challenge**

This term the children are studying, "How was Britain affected by WWII?" To kick-start our learning, we are visiting Millestones Living Museum on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> January to learn about what life was like on the Home Front during World War 2. Later in the term, we will celebrate our own WWII day in school, where children will create some blitz artwork and learn how to swing dance. The children will learn and discuss what happened during WWII throughout this half term. They will consider how countries were affected (including the UK and others) and how it has shaped the world today.

#### **Homework**

We encourage the children to complete the following homework:

- Read 3 times a week (written and signed in homework diary by Friday)
- Practise their weekly spelling words (tested and handed out on Monday)
- 20 minutes playing on Timestable Rockstars
- One piece from the learning challenge homework grid (due in every Friday)

In your child's homework diary, you will see their new spellings for each week. These are handed out on Monday and tested the following Monday. We do try to encourage the children to use different strategies to practise spelling words. The homework tasks are on the homework grid, which should be stuck into your child's homework book. The children are encouraged to think carefully about how they present their homework and house points will be awarded for great effort and care. Moreover, every child should read at home at least 3 times a week.

Supporting your child with their homework shows them you value learning. It also helps them to develop a sense of responsibility and pride. The homework we set links to your child's key learning themes, so will help them feel confident in the classroom.

If your child regularly **does not** hand in their homework, including the practising of their weekly spellings, you will be contacted by the class teacher. Here they will discuss any difficulties you may be facing and try to offer support to help you.

### **Homework Diaries**

Please continue to check and sign the diary regularly. To enable the children to become more independent we encourage the children to show the teacher any messages in their diaries. It should be your child's responsibility to remind you that it needs to be signed.

#### P.E.

P.E. will continue to take place on **Wednesday afternoons** this term. The children will be learning dance and basketball skills. Please ensure your child wears P.E. kit to school on this day.
