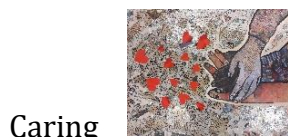




## THE BISHOPSWOOD SCHOOLS FEDERATION

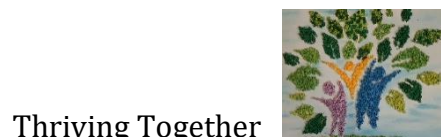

<b>Year R</b>	<b>Term – Spring 1 2024 – Spring Has Sprung!</b>
<b>Subject</b>	<b>Areas Covered</b>
Learning Enrichment	Planting, growing and tasting our own food. Finding out about allotments. Discovering tasty recipes. Sharing seeds with the local community.
<b>Personal, Social, Emotional development</b>	Heart smart (Whole school scheme) - Don't Hold On To What's Wrong Boris the Robot will help us to learn all about what makes a good friend and how to be a good friend. We will think about how to talk and listen to each other, how to play games and take turns and to think about each other's feelings. Continue to develop our understanding of where we belong in our community and the wider world.
<b>Communication and language</b>	Developing our listening skills Learn what a question is, how to ask questions and different ways to find out answers. Exploring new words and vocabulary from our Brilliant books and Concept Cat stories. Learning new rhymes, poems and songs to share and perform. Learn a new sign every week.
<b>Physical development</b>	PE – through stories, learning balance and agility. Weekly fine motor exercises to strengthen our arms, hand and fingers in order to write. Using our writing scheme kinetic letters – practising shape and letter formation. Learning our 'animal positions' to help develop strong bodies for writing eg. strong bear sitting, long lizards.
<b>Literacy</b>	<b><u>Phonics</u></b> Learning a wider range of digraphs (2 letters that join together to make 1 sound, eg ur, ai, oa) Blending (reading) and segmenting (spelling) words with 3 graphemes (sounds), eg map, top, dip and moving onto words which contain digraphs (eg. ship, chop). Building on our knowledge of high frequency words (common words we see regularly in books such as the, was, she) Reading simple words and sentences Writing simple words and sentences  <b><u>Literacy</u></b> Each week we will focus on a new story, so that we can practise skills for blending (reading) or segmenting (spelling).
