Year R	Term – Summer 1 2024 – Egg-citing adventures
Subject	Areas Covered
Learning Enrichment	 Becoming chick and bee experts. Planting, growing and tasting our own food. Discovering tasty recipes. Learning about teeth and how to keep them healthy. Taking apart/re-building different objects and machines.
Personal, Social, Emotional development	 Heart smart (Whole school scheme) - Fake is a mistake Boris the Robot will help us to learn all about understanding the difference between lies and the truth, as well as being honest, kind and caring. Continue to develop our understanding of where we belong in our community and the wider world.
Communication and language	 Developing our listening skills: Learn what a question is, how to ask questions and different ways to find out answers. Exploring new words and vocabulary from our Brilliant books and Concept Cat stories. Learning new rhymes, poems and songs to share and perform. Learn a new sign every week.
Physical	PE – Ball Skills
development	 Weekly fine motor exercises to strengthen our arms, hand and fingers in order to write. Using our writing scheme kinetic letters – practising shape and letter formation. Learning our 'animal positions' to help develop strong bodies for writing eg. strong bear sitting, long lizards.
Literacy	 Phonics Learning a wider range of digraphs (2 letters that join together to make 1 sound, e.g. ow, oi) and trigraphs (3 letters that join together to make 1 sound e.g. igh, ear, air, ure) Continuing to learn about words which contain digraphs e.g. ship, chop. Building on their previous knowledge to read longer words e.g. CCVC and CVCC words such
	 as flap/milk. Building on our knowledge of high frequency words (common words we see regularly in books such as: the, was, she) Reading simple words and sentences. Writing simple phrases and sentences.
	 Literacy Each week we will focus on a new story, so that we can practise skills for blending (reading) or segmenting (spelling). We will learn new words and phrases to extend our vocabulary, composing sentences orally to help retell stories We will practise writing simple sentences.
